#### **Choir Performance**

#### **Remembrance**

#### Pupil Safety Questionnaire

Earlier in the term, our wellbeing ambassadors, Ella-Rose and Oliver, worked with me to develop an online Pupil Safety Questionnaire. The questionnaire was completed by the children across all classes in school on the laptops, with the older children helping the younger children. The School Council analysed the results this week and were pleased overall by the mostly positive feedback. They have created some posters to remind the children who they can talk to if they have any worries, and what to do if they are concerned about bullying. A summary of the results has been attached to this email.

#### **Questionnaires**

I would like to thank everyone who completed the recent online Parent Questionnaire. We received 48 responses in total. Your feedback has been extremely valuable, and we appreciate you taking the time to share your views. We are currently looking closely at the responses, as well as your comments, to identify ways in which we can continue to improve as a school. # This May Help

This May Help is a new national initiative providing mental health advice to parents and carers who may have concerns about their child's mental health. The website gives easy-to-follow advice to help families manage their child's mental health needs. This advice was developed by NHS professionals and parents who've been through their own child's mental health journey. Parents and carers have shared advice that helped them and that may also help other families. The advice covered on 'This May Help' includes: self-harm, gaming and online safety, eating disorders, school avoidance, understanding mental health, understanding teenagers, online threats, building rapport, building resilience, building a support network, self-care tips, managing an emergency, managing in a crisis, and preparing for a children and adolescent mental health services (CAMHS) appointment. These subjects were chosen by families and young people who have gone through their own mental health challenges. Gary Lineker, Myleene Klass, and Tanni Grey-Thompson are amongst 16 presenters featured in the films.

# Bank Holiday 8th May

In honour of the Coronation of His Majesty King Charles III, there will be an extra bank holiday on Monday 8<sup>th</sup> May 2023 and school will be closed on this day. This date was scheduled as the first day of the 2023 Key Stage 2 SATs and we have now received confirmation from the DfE that the tests will take place in the same week, following the usual order but each taking place one day later than originally planned. The new schedule will be:

- Tuesday 9 May: English grammar, punctuation and spelling (GPS) papers 1 (questions) and 2 (spelling)
- Wednesday 10 May: English reading paper
- Thursday 11 May: mathematics papers 1 (arithmetic) and 2 (reasoning)
- Friday 12 May: mathematics paper 3 (reasoning)

We have now moved the bookshelves from the corridor into the new library, which has created much more space in the corridor, and are now just awaiting delivery of the new tables, chairs, shelves, and soft furnishings to make it a truly wonderful place to celebrate reading. Hopefully the project will near completion in January so the children can start to enjoy using their new dedicated library.

## After School Club

#### **Christmas Cards**

From next Monday, the children will be able to post all their Christmas cards to their friends and staff members in the Christmas post box. Please ensure that envelopes clearly show the recipient's first and the initial of their last name, along with their class, to ensure that cards can be delivered successfully e.g. Charlotte D Class 4. Cards can be posted until the last day of term, Friday 16<sup>th</sup> December.

#### **First Admission to School**

Applications for children starting school in Reception next September need to be made by 15<sup>th</sup> January 2023. Parents need to apply at <u>www.admissionsonline.norfolk.gov.uk</u>. If anyone is interested in their child starting here at Denver next September, or knows of anyone else who is interested, please contact the office to arrange a visit.

#### **School Opening Hours**

Just a reminder that the school day starts at 8.50am and finishes at 3.15pm. Any child coming in after 9am will be marked as late and if they are later than 9.10am, this will count as an unauthorised absence. The gate will be locked promptly at 9am and any child coming to school after this time will need to enter school via the office.

We are continually working hard to improve school attendance. Any absence from school has an impact on learning, as is exemplified in the table below. Please remember that holidays in term time will not be authorised.

To help keep you informed of your child's attendance, a letter will be sent out at the end of each half term for those children with an attendance of less than 90%, which is deemed as persistent absence.

Our overall school attendance so far this year is 95.6%, which is lower than our target of 97%. Please work with us to help improve attendance and ensure the best outcomes for our children.

#### Sports News

#### **Cluster Cross Country**

The children in KS2 who achieved a top three place in our intra-competition attended the annual cluster cross country competition which was held at Hillcrest Primary School in Downham Market on Wednesday 2<sup>nd</sup> November 2022. For the first time since the initial lockdown, all schools in the cluster were in attendance with a very high turnout of competitors.

There were girls' and boys' events for each year group with children in Years 3 and 4 completing 2 laps of the field and Years 5 and 5 completing 3 laps. A top three finish resulted in a medal and a top ten finish allowed the children to progress to the next level of competition, the area finals. All the children tried their very best. Our medallists were Mia in 3<sup>rd</sup> place for the Year 4 girls and Joshua-Jon 2<sup>nd</sup> place for Year 6 boys and Theo Ratcliff right on his heels in 3<sup>rd</sup> place.





#### **Cross Country Area Finals**

On Thursday 24<sup>th</sup> November, children who had qualified with a top ten finish in the Downham cluster cross country tournament travelled to Lynnsport to compete in the area finals. The

children did fantastically well showing a whole wealth of School Games values such as determination and resilience.

Mr Peach, who was spectating, kindly offered this review of the Year 3 girls' race:

On Thursday 24th November, Esther and Lorelei competed for Denver in the 2022 West Norfolk Cross country competition. On a very fresh November morning, both girls arrived on time and excited to represent the Denver year 3 girls. Lining up against more than 50 competitors, both Esther and Lorelei made strong starts, with Lorelei storming to 4th place over the first 400m. Esther made a steady but strong start in the middle of the pack. Over the next half of the race both girls who were jostling for position made their way round a long and challenging course, both giving everything and doing Denver proud. As they rounded the final bend, Esther and Lorelei found themselves in a pack of around 10 children; they both managed to finish strongly out sprinting competitors to finish in 30th for Esther and 35th for Lorelei. Amazing achievements and both girls should be very proud of themselves!

A top ten place saw the competitors through to the county finals. Well done to Mia and Joshua-Jon in Class 4 whose 9<sup>th</sup> places secured their advancement to the next stage. A huge thank you to the parents and carers who took the time to take the children to the event.



#### Dodgeball Club

This half term, Reece from Wereham Dodgeball Club has been running a Dodgeball club on Mondays before school from 8-8.45am. This paid club has proved to be very popular with the KS2 children and we are hopefully looking to expand the offer to include KS1 children after Christmas. #### Healthy Body, Healthy Mind

Class 3 have been engaging with the Healthy Body, Healthy Mind programme over the last few Friday afternoons. Rosie has written this report for the newsletter: 'For the first half of

each session we work on lessons e.g. screen time, how and what to eat, how much to drink and what to drink. For the second half we go outside, or into the hall if the weather is bad, to take part in activities that help to keep our bodies and minds healthy.
