Ofsted: The Ofsted inspection that the school underwent in March confirmed our belief that Denver School is not only 'Good' but a school where "Pupils enjoy studying a broad and balanced curriculum. They respond well to teachers' high expectations and try to do the best they can." The children are "proud of their school. They are encouraged to take on leadership roles." and "are excited about the outdoor learning opportunities." The inspector was very positive about the school and encouraged the staff team to continue doing what they do so well!

The New Library: The endeavours of children, parents, staff and the 'Friends of Denver' to raise the funds to convert the old IT room to a beautiful fully functioning Library has been incredible. What a delightful space which constantly has children using it to discover the joys of reading. It has been lovely to see staff and children alike being energised by the development. We are also delighted by the reading focused art that has been gifted to the school to add to the inspiring environment.

SuperTots: An inspired joint project with DMA has resulted in a fortnightly toddler group supported by school volunteers and staffed by students from DMA under the professional eye of Clare Gunns. Parents and their babies and toddlers join together to chat, make things, run around, climb and enjoy being in the school. This was an experiment that we all are delighted with the outcome and look forward to developments in the new year.

Outdoor Learning: This year has seen the introduction of Outdoor Learning which has been such a hit with the

children. It is joyous to see children getting muddy, problem solving together and running around in God's green earth. The Outdoor Learning approach will be developed in future years

Attendance: Nationally, attendance is a problem for schools but with the hard work of our families we are nearly back up to pre-covid levels. So, thank you to everyone for achieving 96% attendance over the year, we look forward to seeing this get back to 97%.

Year 6: A hugely important part of this missive is to celebrate our fabulous Year 6, as they leave us to begin their journey through high school.

The children joined the school in September 2016, when Justin Bieber was top of the Single Charts with 'Cold Water.' That year had a few notable events:

8/6/2017 - A general election was held in the UK, resulting in a hung parliament, with the Conservative Party, led by Prime Minister Theresa May, losing their majority in Parliament.

Over their time in school the children saw the change of headteacher, when in 2019 Mrs Jones was appointed and began to lead the school. They were taught in Class 1 by Mrs Nicholson who has now left and Mr Rackham nurtures our youngest children. In Class 2 the children were taught by Miss Pennock, who continues to teach this class in partnership with Mr Cawley after Mr Sexton left for a move to Scotland. During Class 3, the children were taught by Mr Bonham who continues to teach this class.

Finally, the children have spent the last two years in the charge of Mrs Henden in Class 4.

In discussing with the children their memories of life at Denver I was able to discover a number of surprising facts!

Class 1 – Reception:

They also visited The Maltings in Ely to see a performance of Jack & the Beanstalk. The children walked many miles as walking the Golden Mile was introduced.

Class 3 - Years 3 & 4

This was during the time the world had to deal with Covid 19 and much of 2020 and 2021 were spent in lock down. Before the world stopped the class enjoyed a series of 'OMNES' sporting events including handball and speed stacking. They also watched 'Dick Whittington' at The Maltings Ely in 2019. During Autumn 2020 Class Dojo was introduced and has become popular with staff, children and families. The school also acquired their own star called 'the Denver Bright Star'. Snow fell in the autumn term in 2020 and, as it should be, the children enjoyed playing out in the snow. Unsurprisingly the pantomime trip was cancelled and the children watched 'The Wizard of Oz' online.

Class 4 - Years 5 & 6

The start of a return to normality and the opportunity to go on school trips, participate in tournaments and welcome visitors into school. Mrs Jones introduced 'Hot chocolate with the Head' for children being awarded 'Star of the Week'. The class visited the National Space Museum in Leicester which proved a tiring but enjoyable day visiting the 'Rocket Tower' and enjoying the amazing planetarium show. The Rotary Club set up a Technology challenge for the children, who worked so well together to design and build a bridge that would withstand some heavy forces. The children again time travelled to the Victorian Era and visited a Victorian School, which they found to be very strict! A four-day Bikeability programme was followed by the children, they all achieved well. A Young Leaders training session was run for the children so they can now lead games and challenges during lunch and playtime. The children learned to play the Ukulele with Miss Berners which was highly enjoyable.

The big trip in this class was to go on a residential to Eaton Vale. Most of the children's memories revolve around sweets, not sleeping, creeping around, hiding under beds, playing cards in bed, getting too hot and having to complete quite scary but fulfilling tasks like climbing up and then jumping off a tall vertical structure onto a trapeze.

We thank them for all the jobs they have completed so positively; for their hard work for being a cheerful and positive bunch and wish them well as they launch themselves into the future!
