Class 3 Visit to Cambridge Central Mosque

On Friday 26th April, Class 3 visited the Cambridge Central Mosque to support their RE learning. It was an amazing building which really seemed to impress the children and adults. We learnt that it was designed by the architects who created the London Eye. Our guide, Mohammad, explained all about how they use recycled materials and that they use collected rainwater for the washrooms. The children were very impressed by the motion-activated taps! We learnt about the different prayer times, the items on display and that they host over 400 weddings a year!

Outdoor Learning Grant

We have recently been awarded a grant of £220 from Accent Fresh to support our Outdoor Learning Club. A huge thank you to Accent Fresh for their very kind donation. I am sure Mr Cawley has lots of ideas as to how to put this grant to best use!

Music Grant

Speaking of grants, we have also been awarded a £500 grant from Universal Music UK Sound Foundation and we have purchased a whole class set of ukuleles to enable us to offer whole class ukulele tuition across the school, starting from next year. Again, a huge thank you to Universal Music UK Sound Foundation for this generous donation.

Morning Drop Off

As we are now in the summer term, and to help the children to develop more independence, please can the children in Class 2 be dropped off at the field gate and walk to the classroom without parents. Class 1 parents can continue to bring the children to the Class 1 gate. Thank you for your support with this.

Free School Meals

To help support families through the cost-of-living crisis, the Government has been supporting families of children on Free School Meals with monthly food vouchers. This support was due to finish at the end of March, however the Local Authority recently agreed to continue to provide these monthly food vouchers until October. These will be sent out monthly to the parents of children who receive Free School Meals.

Mutual Respect

At Denver Primary, we are committed to providing a safe environment, and to setting a good example by being professional and courteous. Parents and visitors are always welcome at this school, and if you have any concerns we will always listen and seek to address them. Please, however, remember that staff should also be treated with mutual respect and kindness.

Water Bottles

Please remember that children should bring only plain water to school in their school water bottles, and not flavoured waters or juices. Thank you for your co-operation with this.

Sun Protection

Now that we are in the summer term, and we hopefully start to see some improved weather, the children will spend more time outside. To help protect them from the sun, please ensure that they bring a sun hat and water bottle to school each day, and that they apply sun cream before coming to school on sunny days. Thank you.

Denver Supertots Playgroup

Our Denver Supertots Playgroup will continue to offer sessions on alternate Wednesdays and Fridays from 9.30 - 10.45am throughout the summer term. All pre-school age children and their parents are welcome to attend for a small cost of £1 each child, with children under 1 being free. A variety of games and activities are planned, with refreshments provided for the adults. The playgroup is jointly run by the school and students from Downham Market Academy. Attendance Focus

We are continually working hard to improve school attendance due to the impact that absence from school can have on learning. As part of this work, each newsletter throughout the year has had an attendance focus.

Please remember that, in line with the expectations set out in '<u>Working Together to Improve</u> <u>School Attendance</u>', fixed penalty notices will be issued if the criteria set out in that letter is met.

To promote good attendance, we celebrate the class with the highest attendance each month. April's attendance figures were as follows:

Well done, once again, to Class 1 for having the highest attendance for the month of April.

Our overall school attendance so far this year is **95.8%**, which is lower than our target of 97%. Please help us to support good school attendance to ensure the best outcomes for our children.

<u>Holidays</u>

Please remember that holidays during term time **will not be authorised** and may be considered for a Fixed Penalty Notice should the criteria be met (**9 sessions or 4.5 school days of unauthorised absence within a 6 school week period**). An absence request should be completed **before** any holidays or absence are taken and can be accessed by requesting a link from the school office. It is important that we are made aware of children taking holidays

before they are taken, rather than once children are on holiday as is sometimes the case. Our Attendance Policy is available on our school website.
