**For Y1** pupils this is the use of vocabulary: slower, faster, months of the year, days of the week, telling the time on the hour and half past and drawing hands on a clock to show the time. <u>https://www.twinkl.co.uk/resource/t-n-3077-blank-clock-faces</u>

**Y2** pupils need to compare and sequence intervals of time, tell and write the time to five minutes, including quarter past/to the hour and draw the hands on a clock face to show these times and know the number of minutes in an hour and the number of hours in a day

Click on Online Classroom, subjects (top right hand corner) Y1, Maths, then scroll down to Numbers 50 – 100 and beyond. There are 5 lessons to follow.

Click *online Classroom, subjects* (top right hand corner) *Y2, Maths,* then scroll down and begin at lesson 10. There are 6 lessons, the final one of which is very useful to determine how much the children have learnt.

There is a short quiz on some of the work they have done on fractions, position and movement and time.

#### Week 5 and 6. Y1 & Y2.

#### Explanation writing.

This follows on from Instructions that they did last week.

When you have watched this a couple of times, the children could have a go at writing an explanation text about something they know how to do. You will notice it is different from instructions. Instead of : Find somewhere to take your photo, (Instructions) Chris says : You need to find somewhere to take your photo.

There are lots of technical words in the clip, the children will be familiar with some of them, but do not worry too much about their use.

How to grow a sunflower.

The children can then have a go at writing their own explanation text for How to Grow a Sunflower.

They should think about what they did:

eg: First I needed to find a pot and put some soil in it.(First I found a small pot)

Then I made a hole in the soil with my finger and dropped the tiny seed in.

They can add photos of their pots, the seedlings as they grow, measuring the seedlings.

This topic links to their science and the booklet that they have been given to complete.

(They need to ensure they do it in the correct order)
