Judith's Retirement

As many of you will be aware, the Reverend Judith Grundy is retiring at half term. She has been a key figure over the years in ensuring such strong links between the school and the church community. She led her last assembly on Tuesday and I know that the children will miss her weekly visits in to school. On behalf of the children, staff and governors, I would like to thank Judith for everything she has done for the school over the years. She will be sorely missed by the whole school community.

Playground Extension

Over the half term break, providing the weather conditions are suitable, we are having the area at the end of the playground re-surfaced with a fibre fall surface. Organising the project has been a lengthy process with a few hurdles along the way, although I am excited that this area will now be transformed, enabling it to be used in PE lessons, and to provide a dedicated area for Playground Challenges. The project has been supplemented by a significant grant of £10,000 from the Sugar Tax, as well as the Sports Premium grant received by schools. If inclement weather does not allow the project to be finished over the break, there may be some temporary disruption when the children return. Please bear with us if this is the case.

Staff News

I am pleased to inform you that Mrs Collins has recently returned to school. She will be spending some time in the office and also supporting in Class 3 from after half term. It is lovely to have her back in school again. We also have a Level 3 Teaching Assistant student, Chloe Loveridge, starting after half term. She will be working in school 3 days each week and will provide support across the school during her placement with us.

Certificates

In order to provide more instant feedback to parents about children's progress, we have been sending out some new certificates at the end of the school day. Lunchtime stickers and certificates are also being awarded to children who have a really positive lunchtime, are helpful to others or show good manners. Special Headteacher postcards sent home by post from myself will be awarded to those children who have really stood out, going above and beyond; the first of these postcards was sent home last week. We hope that this instant feedback will be useful in helping parents to celebrate their child's successes.

Parent Consultation Evenings

Thank you to all parents who attended Parent Consultation Evenings this week. These are always an excellent opportunity to discuss your child's progress with their class teacher.
