# **Sportshall Athletics**

On Tuesday 3<sup>rd</sup> December, 18 children (9 boys and 9 girls) from Class 3 travelled to Lynnsport to take part in the area SSP Sportshall Athletics event. It was well attended with 21 schools from the area taking part over the course of the day.

All events were held indoors. There were a number of track events: 1 lap relay, 2 lap relay, 4 x 1 lap relay, 2 x 2 lap relay and an obstacle course. On the other side of the hall there were the following field events: foam javelin, chest push, standing long jump, five strides, vertical jump and the speed bounce.

Each member of the team was allowed to enter two track and two field events to earn points for the team. Denver participated well but did not progress to the county finals.
