Healthy School

We attempt to educate the children about healthy eating and keeping themselves fit. We provide nutritious school lunches which we encourage children to eat and also teach them to prepare and cook food which is good for them. Following advice from our Fire Officer, the Governing Body has decided to make it mandatory that **all** pupils should have a book bag from September 2019. This is due to the increased fire safety risk caused by rucksacks blocking fire exits in school, a problem highlighted in the last Governing Body newsletter. Book bags can also easily be stored in the classroom.

The Friends of Denver School have kindly offered to buy a book bag for all children currently in Years 3, 4 and 5, as well as the new Reception intake. The children currently in Years 1 and 2 already use book bags. The new book bags will be given to the children by the end of the school year. PE bags will also be issued to the aforementioned year groups.

Since returning from the Easter holidays, Denver children have enjoyed a number of sporting activities. KLCF has commenced a Monday club for tennis and athletics, Martyn Wardle from Denver Cricket club has provided a Kwik Cricket club on a Tuesday and Mrs Henden is leading a Tri-golf and Golden Mile club on a Thursday.

On Wednesday 22^{nd} May, 10 children from Class 4 participated in the cluster Kwik Cricket tournament. The skills they had learnt in club paid off as they finished an impressive second and progressed to the area finals, which were held on Thursday 6^{th} June at North Runcton Cricket Club.

On Thursday 23rd May, four children from Class 3 participated in the cluster mini-tennis competition, representing themselves and the school admirably.

It included a number of challenging activities such as abseiling and raft building, encouraging the children to work as a team and to venture out of their comfort zones.

The children in Class 3 completed their OMNES Games activities at Lynnsport when the final group took part in the Ultimate Frisbee challenge. This was very much enjoyed by all who took part. The OMNES Games events have been important in increasing the range of activities available to the children.

Forthcoming events include Sports Day, the third and final Active Kids session, Area Sports and our School Games intra-sports festival.
