# **Class 4's National Space Centre Adventure**



On Monday 18<sup>th</sup> November, Class 4 travelled to the National Space Centre in Leicester to further their understanding of their current science topic 'Earth and Space'.

The children explored the different galleries, their interactive displays, games and shows. Rocket Tower told the story of the race between the Soviet Union and the United States of America to launch a person into space and then to land on the Moon. The downstairs galleries included 'Space Travel', 'The Universe and the Big Bang', 'Outer

Space', 'The Solar System', 'Earth and Moon' and 'Tranquility Base Astronaut Training'.

One of the highlights of the day was the 'Astronaut' show in the Planetarium. It really did feel as though the children were training as astronauts and were experiencing the unusual effects of being in space. Many had to look away

when the centrifuge was spinning as it was so realistic and stomach churning.

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Although the journey was quite long, the children were a credit to the school and had a fantastic time; some have already said they want to convince their parents to take them back again, so be warned!

#### **Scholastic Book Fair**

We were extremely pleased with the success of the recent Scholastic Book Fair. Total sales



were in excess of £750, meaning that we received this value in new books for the school, a welcome addition to the library shelves. The new books will soon be added to the library, providing exciting new material to inspire the children with their reading. 
# **Dodgeball Tournament**

# **Young Leaders**

Since returning from the half-term break, all children in Class 4 have been taking part in the 'Young Leader' training course delivered by King's Lynn Community Football Club coaches. The course leads to children achieving 'Playmaker' awards and equips them with the skills to be able to create, organise and lead a range of PE games and sporting activities in school, including festivals. The award also recognises leadership in the activities that they do outside of school. The principles of leadership taught are PACE – People, Area, Communication and Equipment. The children learn through playing different games what is effective and what works less well so that they can consider these variables when arranging their own events.
