# Bikeability – 4-7<sup>th</sup> May

We are really fortunate to have secured free Bikeability training funded via Norfolk County Council for all of our Y5 children next week. The Bikeability award scheme is the national standard for cycling which aims to encourage more children to cycle. The course is designed to equip cyclists with the knowledge, skill, and on-road experience to make a journey safely and confidently by bike on local roads. The children are really looking forward to taking part.

# School Photographs – 11<sup>th</sup> May

We have arranged for Tempest Photography to come into school on Tuesday 11<sup>th</sup> May to take the traditional school photographs, both of individuals and siblings. Measures have been put in place to ensure that this can happen in a Covid secure way. # Walk to School Week - 17th-21st

To encourage our children to be more active, and to support our efforts to become an Ecoschool, we are taking part in Walk to School Week from 17<sup>th</sup>-21<sup>st</sup> May. If at all possible, we would like to encourage the children to walk to school each day during this week, or if you live a considerable distance from the school for them to walk for part of the way. Each class will be recording participation and certificates will be awarded at the end of the week.

# Sports Day - 22<sup>nd</sup> June

Our annual Sports Day will take place on Tuesday 22<sup>nd</sup> June this year. It will take a different format than normal with both KS1 and KS2 joining in with traditional races to avoid the mixing of bubbles. At this point, we do not know if parents will be able to spectate, but we will try to achieve this if at all possible. Should the weather not be kind to us, we have a reserve date for Wednesday 23<sup>rd</sup> June.

# Eaton Vale- 28th and 29th June

With the government's roadmap now set out, school visits can now once again take place, although all things considered, we decided to transfer the Eaton Vale booking for our current

Y5 children onto next year when we hope that they will be able to gain the full residential experience, hopefully without any restrictions. However, we did not want our Y6 children to miss out on this opportunity, therefore we have arranged for them to attend 2 day visits to Eaton Vale on Monday 28<sup>th</sup> and Tuesday 29<sup>th</sup> June. The children will still take part in the same activities that were planned in the residential package and we are confident that these day visits can take place in a Covid secure way. # Parent Consultation Evenings – 14<sup>th</sup> and 15<sup>th</sup> July

We have decided to have our Parent Consultation Evenings towards the end of the summer term to give the children more time back in school with their teachers, and to enable us to carry out assessments enabling us provide accurate feedback about the children's attainment and progress. End of year reports will be sent out the week previously to allow parents to read these and have the opportunity to ask the class teachers any questions. Following positive feedback about the phone calls back in the autumn term, we have decided that these consultations will take place via Teams. More details will follow later in the term.

The Denver Fun Day this year will take place on Sunday 18<sup>th</sup> July. We are thrilled to have secured a slot for our school choir to perform and I know they are already busy preparing for this event. The Friends of Denver School will also have a stall.
