By now you will have all received your child's end of year report and had the chance to discuss this with your child's class teacher at last week's parent consultations. Thank you for your feedback regarding the new format, these will be taken on board.

We are very keen to welcome volunteers back in school in September. We have a number of regular volunteers who come in to school to listen to readers, help on school events and trips etc. and we would like to expand our team. ## **September**

In line with recent guidance from the government, many restrictions for schools will be lifted in September. We will no longer need to organise our children in 'bubbles' and social distancing measures will be removed. Parents will also not be required to wear masks on the school grounds. Some measures, however, such as handwashing, increased cleaning and ventilation will still be in place.

As a result of the changes, we will be going back to our usual start and finish times of 8.50am-3.15pm for all children. We have decided to keep using the field gate as the only access into school. This is a much safer way for the children to come in and leave the school grounds, and I personally enjoy greeting the children every day. KS1 parents will continue to come onto the school grounds to take their children to the Class 1 gate.

Our risk assessment will be updated to take into consideration these changes and will be available by the end of the summer on our school website.

There is still a lot of uncertainty about what will happen if children, or their immediate family members, test positive for Covid-19 in September. We will communicate guidance with you once we receive it.

We have decided to go back to asking the children to bring in 20p in cash for their drinks. Ideally, children will bring in £1 in a named envelope at the beginning of the week. Milk, apple juice and orange juice will be available.

Should guidance change over the summer, we will communicate with you via the website. If you have any questions or concerns about September, please do not hesitate to contact me.
