# **Royal Mail Heroes Stamp Competition**

An incredible 606,049 entries were received from children across the UK, with an amazing 7,479 schools taking part. Although we did not have any individual winners, all the children who entered contributed towards a GUINNESS WORLD RECORDS<sup>™</sup> title for the largest postage stamp design competition! The school has been presented with a special certificate which is proudly on display in the entrance hall.

#### **Blue Peter Badge Winners**

In the summer term, Blue Peter ran a Supersized Climate Heroes competition for children who show that they care about the environment and our planet. Our wellbeing gardening group were keen to apply and absolutely thrilled that their application to become Blue Peter Climate Heroes was successful. Not only have they each been awarded with a special Green Blue Peter Badge, they can also apply for a Blue Peter Badge Card to gain free access to over 200 attractions throughout the UK. Well done to our gardeners, what a fantastic achievement!



#### Eco Committee

We are keen to get our Eco Committee up and running again this term and the number of applications received from the children highlights the passion in the school for environmental issues. One of our focus areas this term will be on reducing our use of single use plastic within the school. ### PE Uniform

As we have continued to ask children to come to school wearing PE kit on the days they have PE, we would like to remind parents of appropriate PE kit. The children should wear the following:

- Plain PE t-shirt in the appropriate team colour, ideally with the Denver School crest
- For colder weather plain blue or black jogging/tracksuit bottoms, a plain blue or black long-sleeved warm top, socks and trainers
- For warmer weather plain blue or black shorts, plimsolls/trainers, socks
- For children with long hair, please provide a hairband so that hair can be tied up

#### **Bikeability**

Last week we were joined by two instructors from Outspoken Training for Year 5 children to receive four days of intensive Bikeability Cycling Proficiency training. For Level One training, the children were taught how to check a bicycle for roadworthiness and how to perform safe starting, stopping, turning and signalling manoeuvres from within the school grounds.

Successful completion of Level One allowed the children to move on to Level 2 and practise their skills on progressively busy roads. This is included how to position at junctions and how to navigate parked vehicles and obstacles. The instructors remarked upon the good skills and behaviour. The children learnt a great deal about road safety and thoroughly enjoyed the experience. We are very thankful to the instructors and a very special thank you also goes to Mrs Dawson who kindly gave up her time to support both groups for the entire four day period.

On Wednesday 22<sup>nd</sup> September, it was National Fitness Day so we joined in with the Alive Leisure initiative to complete an active mile. Each class had some time on the Golden Mile track to complete 8 laps and meet the target. Well done to everyone!
