There was much excitement in last Friday's Celebration Assembly as we announced the winner of the 'Name the Easter Bunny' competition. A very lucky Libby, in Class 1, had her name of Butterfly Rainbows (an excellent choice I'm sure you'll agree) picked out of the Easter basket. A huge thank you to everyone for participating in the competition, and to Kathryn Williams for donating the bunny. A pleasing £67 was raised, all of which will go into The Friends' funds!



# Science Day - 14th March

To mark British Science Week 2022, a science curriculum day was held across the school on 14<sup>th</sup> March, the theme being 'Growth'. The classes began with class assemblies exploring the theme of growth in a wide range of aspects of our lives. We then focussed in particular on learning about the growth and reproduction of plants to link to the STEMPOINT EAST science and technology challenge that was to come later in the day.

In Class 3, the children learnt about the life cycle of plants and the different ways that seeds are dispersed. This resulted in some lovely role play to demonstrate what they had learnt. In this picture the children are demonstrating how coconut seeds are dispersed in water.



In Class 4, the children looked at the reproductive parts of flowering plants and learnt about the crucial role of bees.

In the afternoon, the STEMPOINT EAST challenge began. The children in all classes had to plan and make a free-standing plant using only 4 pieces of A4 paper and scissors. No glue or tape was allowed. Techniques such as slotting, folding and creating tabs were practised then the children had just one hour to make their plants.

It was a really enjoyable and successful day with plenty of learning. At the end of the week, the children in Key Stage 2 also took part in the national poster competition to express their knowledge and understanding of growth.

#### **World Water Day**

To enrich their learning in geography, Class 4 took part in a special online assembly to mark World Water Day on Tuesday 22<sup>nd</sup> March. The assembly taught them about the importance of the water cycle and that there is one constant cycle of water on the planet. They also learnt about how geology affects the location of suitable supplies of ground water. Being chalky, this area has good stores of groundwater but these need to be protected from harmful chemicals and pollution. The assembly also talked about the important work of Water Aid in protecting water supplies and getting it to people where there are problems such as droughts and floods that have affected the supplies. The children discovered that 1 in 10 people throughout the world do not have access to clean water close to their homes.



#### **Rising Theatre Star**

Louie, in Class 3, has been attending Theatre Train Professional Training in the Performing Arts in King's Lynn since he was 5 years old. They are currently putting on a show at the Guild Hall Arts Centre in King's Lynn called A Night at the Movies. The children had the opportunity to put together a monologue from a film and audition for it to be part of the show. Louie chose to perform the 'Life is like a box of chocolates' scene from Forrest Gump in his audition and he did so well that he was chosen to perform it as part of the show. What a fantastic achievement, well done Louie!



#### **World Book Day**

After the disruption of the last few years, it was lovely to celebrate World Book Day together as a school this year. As usual, the children (and adults!) dressed up as their favourite book characters and took part in different activities to celebrate reading, including reading to children in other classes. They also took home a £1 World Book Day voucher.

Throughout this half term, we have been promoting vegetable consumption by engaging in the 'Eat Them to Defeat Them' campaign. Each week, we have focused on a different vegetable, with the final week being the humble pea. We have been really impressed by the amount of children eating, or at least trying, their veg — well done children! Thank you to Mrs Fenn for ensuring that each veg of the week has been included in the menu, and to parents/carers for helping us to promote the campaign.





#### **Eco-Schools**

The Eco-Committee are continuing to work hard towards the school achieving the Eco-Schools award. The School Council kindly purchased hi-vis jackets, gloves and litter pickers and the Eco members have now started a weekly litter pick on the school grounds. #### Bishop Stephen's Lent Challenge

Throughout the period of Lent, we have we have been engaging with Bishop Stephen's Lent Challenge, the theme of which this year has been Brave Believers. This year, the Lent Challenge has partnered with World Vision to explore how the Christian faith can help us all to work together across the world. The children have engaged with a range of activities, including writing poems about bravery and exploring the work of World Vision.



#### **Prayer Flags**

On Thursday 10<sup>th</sup> March, Class 4 were joined by Carole Reich, one of our school governors, to make prayer flags for the school. She taught the children about the origin of prayer flags and the use of symbolism. The children wrote some very heartfelt prayers about current world events. Many of the children linked their prayers to the school vision of letting our lights shine and to Bishop Stephen's Lent Challenge of being a 'Brave Believer'. The children invented their own symbols with a particular meaning to them. Lots of the examples linked to the Christian values we have been studying, such as compassion and hope. For those of you who attended the Easter Service, you may have seen these displayed in the church. These will also be displayed in our reflection area. A huge thank you to Carole for giving up her time to help the children.







# **Easter Service**

On 30<sup>th</sup> March, we shared an Easter Service with our families at St Mary's Church, Denver. The service included readings, a performance from each class and the choir and prayers. The children all received Palm Crosses which were blessed in the service. A huge thank you to our Foundation Governors, Carole, Janet and Jo, for their help in putting together the assembly, along with Mr Lawrence for his hard work in teaching the children the songs.



#### Covid-19 Update

As I'm sure you will all appreciate, this term has been quite challenging due to the high levels of Covid amongst both staff and children. Since the return from the Christmas break, we have had over 60 positive cases in school, and staff absence has, at times, been difficult to manage. Despite the challenges, I would like to say a huge thank you to everyone in the school community for your understanding, and for acting responsibly by keeping those infected at home. I am really proud of the staff team for their flexibility and determination to minimise the impact on the children's learning – thank you!

We are still awaiting confirmation from the DfE as to what will happen after the Easter break regarding testing and positives cases. We will keep you informed as soon as we receive more guidance.
