Crucial Crew is a multi-agency project, led by Norfolk Fire & Rescue Service, engaging with Year 6 students across the county delivering safety messages in a fun and interactive way through hazards presented in a safe environment. Our Year 6 children usually attend King's Lynn Fire Station in late April for a series of workshops.

They've temporarily closed their 2020 Norfolk Crucial Crew events but they won't let a pandemic stop them from keeping everyone safe at home! So they've launched online Crucial Crew for children of all ages to learn with an adult how to stay safe at home, on the water, online and on the roads.
